


JUDGES & LAWYERS:

The Indiana Supreme Court is celebrating the bicentennial by holding an oral argument in the original Supreme Court Courtroom.

The five justices will hear a modern day case in Corydon's 1816 setting. The Department of Education is videotaping the argument, expected to be online April 22.

Your help is needed by volunteering to speak in a local classroom.

Enhance students' viewing of the 40 minute oral argument by going into a classroom. Reach out to a school district, principal, or teacher in your community. Ask those educators if you can visit their classroom to talk about the judicial branch.
