After the Hamilton County Courts have re-adopted or modified the above local rules (which collectively constitute the courts' Caseload Allocation Plan), these rules will be submitted to the Indiana Supreme Court by August 1, 2015, and will be effective upon approval by the Supreme Court. If approved, the effective date for any modification to these rules, and any other rule changes not requiring Supreme Court approval, will be January 1, 2016.
