

## **LR91-AR1-GEN-32 Allocation of Judicial Resources**

### **(A) Criminal Cases:**

(1) All murder, felony, misdemeanor, infraction, ordinance violation, miscellaneous criminal (MC), and post conviction relief cases shall be filed in the Superior Court.

### **(B) Juvenile Cases:**

(1) All juvenile cases shall be filed in the Circuit Court.

### **(C) Civil Cases:**

(1) All adoption (AD), domestic relations (DR), estate (ES/EU), guardianship (GU), mental health (MH), protective order (PO), reciprocal support (RS), and trust (TR) cases shall be filed in the Circuit Court.

(2) All small claim (SC) cases shall be filed in the Superior Court.

(3) Civil plenary (CP), mortgage foreclosure (MF), civil collection (CC), civil tort (CT), and civil miscellaneous (MI) cases may be filed in either the Circuit Court or the Superior Court.

Further, the White Circuit Court and the White Superior Court have concurrent jurisdiction, pursuant to I.C. 33-33-91-4, and either Judge may with the consent of the other judge sit as Judge of either Court.
