

THE JULY 2016 INDIANA BAR EXAM)

ORDER

Applicants seeking admission to the bar of this Court by written examination must, among other things, be a graduate of, or within 100 days of graduating from, an American Bar Association-accredited law school. Ind. Admission and Discipline Rule 13, §§ 4(A), 5. The Indiana Tech Law School in Fort Wayne, Indiana, is seeking ABA accreditation and anticipates receiving the ABA’s final decision by June 4, 2016. The law school will graduate its charter class of students shortly after that date, and many of its charter class members would like to sit for the July 2016 Indiana bar examination. However, applications for the July 2016 bar examination must be submitted in April 2016, *see* Admis. Disc. R. 15—before the ABA is likely to have rendered its decision.

In view of those circumstances, the Court orders as follows:

Members of the charter class of the Indiana Tech Law School graduating in June 2016 who, but for the educational requirement contained in Admission and Discipline Rule 13, section 4(a), would be eligible to sit for the July 2016 examination, shall be permitted to apply for the July 2016 bar examination in accordance with Admission and Discipline Rule 15.

If the Council of Legal Education and Admission to the Bar of the American Bar Association does not approve Indiana Tech Law School’s application by June 4, 2016, then the Indiana Tech Law School graduates who applied for the July 2016 bar examination (under special authorization by this order) shall not be eligible to sit for the examination. The Board of Law Examiners shall refund their application fees, *see* Admis. Disc. R. 15.
