Order Appointing Members to the Commission on Race and Gender Fairness

Pursuant to Indiana Administrative Rule 4(C), the Indiana Supreme Court created a Commission on Race and Gender Fairness to study the status of race and gender fairness in Indiana's justice system and to investigate ways to improve race and gender fairness not only in the courts and legal system, but also among legal service providers, state and local government, and public organizations. Additionally, the Commission on Race and Gender Fairness was charged with recommending to the Supreme Court the implementation of policies and procedures to meet its stated objectives. Consistent with the mandates of Indiana Administrative Rule 4(C)(1), the Indiana Supreme Court appoints individuals to the Commission from the Indiana judiciary, the practicing bar, academia, state and local government, law enforcement and corrections, and public organizations, each for a term of five (5) years.

The Court now APPOINTS the following individuals to the Indiana Supreme Court Commission on Race and Gender Fairness: Dean Andrew R. Klein of Indianapolis, Lun Kham Pieper of Indianapolis, and Evelyn Ridley-Turner of Indianapolis. Their terms are effective January 1, 2016, and shall expire on June 30, 2020, or when a successor is appointed.
