**ORDER REMANDING JURISDICTION TO TRIAL COURT**

Comes now the Clerk of the Dearborn Circuit Court, and pursuant to Ind.Trial Rule 53.1, certifies this matter here for the appointment of a special judge.

And this Court, being duly advised, now finds that jurisdiction of this matter should be remanded to the Dearborn Circuit Court and Special Judge Anthony C. Meyer. In this case involving a petition for a writ of habeas corpus, the petitioner filed a praecipe, citing Ind. Trial Rule 53.1, seeking withdrawal of the submission because the court had not ruled on his petition or set it for hearing within thirty (30) days. However, the time limits of Ind. Trial Rule 53.1 do not apply to a petition for a writ of habeas corpus. *Julkes v. State*, 295 N.E.2d 619, 260 Ind. 334 (1973).

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that jurisdiction of this matter is remanded to the Dearborn Circuit Court and Special Judge Anthony C. Meyer.
