2011 PLAN SUMMARY

1. Please write a brief summary of the 2011 grant request. Please include information regarding your district's planned activities including committee meetings, training, attorney recognition, newspaper or magazine articles, marketing and promotion. Of the 14 judicial districts ours is second highest in terms of poverty population. (See Attachment 2). Since 2008 we have experienced a 65% increase in requests for assistance...despite only responding to calls two and a half days a week. Therefore, instead of hiring additional "support/clerical staff" we have recently hired an additional half-time paralegal to assist our attorney assistant in screening clients and assisting with referrals.

Our Committee continues to meet quarterly and has set up Lawyer Recruitment, Law Firm Recruitment and CLE/Public Information subcommittees. Having these committees be more active is a major goal in increasing our volunteer panel.

We will continue to work with our libraries in support of the Talk to a Lawyer Today event and other legal information events and two of our bar associations, Kimbrough Bar in Gary and LaPorte County Bar, have virtually taken over the staffing and operation of two of our TALT sites.

A new area of legal work that has developed in the First District is in the area of elder law, particularly adult guardianships. There are two not-for-profit adult guardianship services now established in NW Indiana and we will continue to be the primarily referral service for one of them, Northwest Indiana Adult Guardianship Services (NIAGS), which is a successor organization to Volunteer Advocates for Seniors, a temporary guardianship service that works primarily with our local hospitals in discharge planning. An attorney who volunteers for the second organization, located in LaPorte County, Cynthia Hedge of Michigan City, is our 2010 Richard P. Komyatte Access to Justice Award recipient. She did the legal work for 14 adult guardianships in addition to providing legal services to the organizations corporate board.

In addition to the foreclosure training we provided in 2009 we now have been asked to assist with planning for the Supreme Court's foreclosure settlement conference project which is rolling out into Lake and Porter Counties as this report is being submitted. We will continue to assist with this project in 2011.

Our Judicial Appointee, Judge Tavitas, will continue to visit our various county bar associations to promote pro bono and recognize volunteers. She also continues as an active member of the Pro Bono Commission and the follow-up working group from the 2008 Access to Justice Conference and is on the Board of Indiana Legal Services, along with administering a pro se clinic in her family court that has been a model for similar projects in other districts. We also will be collaborating with her on both representation and Guardian ad Litem services under the Lake County Bar Association's Modest Means project.

Our Plan Administrator is a member of the pro se clinic Advisory Board, chairs the Lake County Bar Association Pro Bono Committee, is co-chair of the ISBA Pro Bono Committee, and is a member of the Board of Directors for Sojourner Truth House, a day

shelter for women and children, and of the Northwest Indiana Workforce Board. We also make annual presentations at the Applied Professionalism CLE given annually for NW Indiana new attorneys.

Last but not least, our annual Volunteer Night at the Gary SouthShore Railcats minor league baseball stadium, preceded by supper and awards at the adjacent restaurant will continue as a very popular and increasingly family event.

In this age of recession First District attorneys continue to step up to help the increasing numbers of folks who turn to us for help to save their homes, protect their safety, marital assets, and relationships with their children, and assist them with the challenges of disability, aging, and general impoverishment. We are honored to help.

2009 REPORT

Please provide a short summary of how the provision of pro bono service is coordinated in your district, including the intake process, the relationships of pro bono providers in the districts, how referrals are made, and how reporting is done.

Aside from Indiana Legal Services and the Valparaiso University School of Law student clinics, the only other known provider of civil pro bono services in the First District is the City of Hammond Legal Aid Clinic established in late 2004. That clinic limits its services to individuals who have been residents of the city of Hammond for at least nine (9) months and is staffed by two (2) attorneys, a secretary, and legal interns using substantial funds appropriated by the Hammond City Council. The City has executed a policy requiring attorneys who have contracts with the City to do a certain amount of pro bono work. Staff attorneys also provide representation.

We have a cordial and collaborative relationship with all three of the above entities. However, despite our ongoing requests, we do not receive any reports from the City of Hammond Clinic on how much service is actually provided by pro bono attorneys and how much by staff.

Our intake process: We do all the pro bono referrals for clients of the Gary and South Bend ILS offices in the counties in our district. ILS staff forwards intake and eligibility information to us. In 2009 we received 123 referrals from ILS, about 20% of our total intake. We also take applications via phone and email from individuals referred by various social services entities, courts, other attorneys, and the Web. Our staff also provides a substantial amount of legal advice and information to clients while they are on the waiting list for an attorney.

We send regular queries to our volunteers to track the status of the case, the number of hours donated, and any requests for supportive services or reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses. Upon notification by the attorney that representation is concluded, a satisfaction questionnaire is sent to the client. Favorable responses are forwarded to the volunteer as part of our thank you process.

Please describe any special circumstances affecting your District's 2009 implementation of its plan.

Requests for assistance increased 66.6%...from 381 in 2008 to 635 in 2009. Although we had added a half-time attorney assistant in addition to our full-time Plan Administrator the increased demand certainly strained our capacity. We therefore budgeted to add additional support staff for 2010 and implementing a website/web application process.

In 2009 we also had two new projects to manage: the Supreme Court's Foreclosure Training for attorneys and mediators in July and our reception as part of the national Pro Bono Celebration in October. We expected to have many more referrals for foreclosure defense or representation at settlement conferences than have actually materialized.

One of our other projects, establishment of a pro se clinic in our largest juvenile court also stalled, hopefully only temporarily, because of budgetary cut-backs in the county court system.

Lines (B) (1), (2), (3), (4) Please indicate the number of hours per week for each personnel position, rate of pay, and all employee benefits.

(B)(1) Plan Administrator (30 yrs experience) salary is \$75,000 with no benefits other than mileage reimbursement. 40 hour week. No increases 2010, or 2011.

(B)(2) Attorney Assistant: \$25,000, 20 hours/week, no increases 2010 or 2011.

Paralegal Assistant: \$15/hr, 20 hours/week. We had previously budgeted adding other support staff on the administrative side in 2010 but due to the major increase in demand (66% increase in 2009, continuing 2010) had to change our plans and recently added a half-time paralegal.

(B)(3) Shared clerk/secretary: \$8.50/hr, about 4 hrs/week, rent also includes receptionist services.

(B)(4) Only WC benefits for 2009 and 2010 to date, however, we will be subject to Unemployment Tax effective 3rd quarter 2010.

(B)(10) We are in the process of setting up a website and web-application. These expenses are uncertain at this time. We also have not yet incurred our major recognition or insurance expenses.

(C) (1) Please describe the occupancy cost in terms of square footage, utilities or other amenities and indicate whether the occupancy cost is above or below the market rate for that space.

Our monthly rent includes two individual offices totaling about 160 square feet, internet, parking, cleaning, shared receptionist assistance, library/conference room, kitchen and all utilities except phone; This is well within or under current market rates.

(C)(9): Dues & fees include a \$25 wire-in fee for IOLTA deposit; NLADA dues, and miscellaneous bank fees, and fee for filing Amended Articles of Incorporation/name change

(A)(2): Due in part to delay in adding additional staff some expenses contemplated for 2010 have been less than anticipated. We are also cutting as much expense as we can this year to have a cushion for the anticipated reduction in IOLTA for 2011. However, of the 14 judicial districts District One has the second highest population, 14% of Indiana's poverty population, second highest in the state, and 40,000 more in poverty than the next highest district (See Attachment 2). We substantially reduced our request for IOLTA funds for the current year, 2010, and have reduced non-personnel line items for 2011. If we are to have a prayer of meeting the overwhelming need for our services we cannot realistically budget for less than what is shown.
