## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1219

---

DIGEST OF HB 1219 (Updated February 11, 1998 6:49 pm - DI 76)

**Citations Affected:** IC 16-18; IC 16-41.

**Synopsis:** Shaken baby syndrome. Allows the state department of health, with the assistance of the division of family and children, to establish an educational prevention and awareness program about shaken baby syndrome. Provides that if a program is established, the state department of health and the division of family and children must do the following: (1) Design and implement strategies for raising public awareness concerning the causes and nature of shaken baby syndrome. (2) Provide at no cost readily understandable information and instructional material regarding shaken baby syndrome to hospitals

## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1219

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-97 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1998]: Sec. 97. "Division" means  
3 the following:

4 (1) For purposes of IC 16-22-8, ~~has~~ the meaning set forth in  
5 IC 16-22-8-3.

6 (2) For purposes of IC 16-28, a group of individuals under the  
7 supervision of the director within the state department assigned  
8 the responsibility of implementing IC 16-28.

9 (3) **For purposes of IC 16-41-40, the meaning set forth in**

11 SECTION 2. IC 16-18-2-328.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
12 CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
13 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1998]: **Sec. 328.5. "Shaken baby syndrome",**

2 SECTION 3. IC 16-41-40 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
3 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
4 JULY 1, 1998]:

5 **Chapter 40. Shaken Baby Syndrome Education**

6 **Sec. 1.** As used in this chapter, "division" refers to the division  
7 of family and children established by IC 12-13-1-1.

8 **Sec. 2.** As used in this chapter, "shaken baby syndrome" refers  
9 to the vigorous shaking of an infant or a young child that may:

- 10 (1) result in bleeding inside the head; and  
11 (2) cause one (1) or more of the following conditions:  
12 (A) Irreversible brain damage.  
13 (B) Blindness, retinal hemorrhage, or eye damage..  
14 (C) Cerebral palsy.  
15 (D) Hearing loss.  
16 (E) Spinal cord injury, including paralysis.  
17 (F) Seizures.  
18 (G) Learning disability.  
19 (H) Death.  
20 (I) Central nervous system injury as evidenced by central  
21 nervous system hemorrhaging.  
22 (J) Closed head injury.  
23 (K) Rib fracture.  
24 (L) Subdural hematoma.

25 **Sec. 3. (a)** The state department, with the assistance of the  
26 division, may establish a program focusing on awareness and  
27 prevention of shaken baby syndrome.

28 (b) If a program is established under subsection (a), the state  
29 department or the division may contract with a statewide nonprofit  
30 organization with experience and knowledge in shaken baby  
31 syndrome to implement all or part of the program.

32 **Sec. 4.** If the state department and the division establish a  
33 program under section 3 of this chapter, the state department, with  
34 the assistance of the division, shall design and implement strategies  
35 for raising public awareness concerning the causes and nature of  
36 shaken baby syndrome, including the following:

- 37 (1) Factors placing parents, guardians, and other caregivers  
38 at risk for shaking an infant.  
39 (2) The risks associated with shaking an infant.  
40 (3) Suggestions for preventing shaken baby syndrome.

41 **Sec. 5. (a)** A program established under this chapter must  
42 include the distribution of readily understandable information and

1 instructional materials regarding shaken baby syndrome,  
 2 explaining its medical effects on infants and children and  
 3 emphasizing preventive measures.

4 (b) The information and instructional materials described in  
 5 subsection (a) must be provided without cost by the following:

6 (1) Each hospital licensed under IC 16-21, to a parent or  
 7 guardian of each newborn upon discharge from the hospital.

8 (2) The division of family and children to each provider (as  
 9 defined in IC 12-7-2-149(4) or IC 12-7-2-149(5)) when:

10 (A) the provider applies for a license from the division  
 11 under IC 12-17.2 or IC 12-17.4; or

12 (B) the division inspects a facility operated by a provider.

13 **Sec. 6.** The state department, with the assistance of the division,  
 14 may do the following:

15 (1) Work to improve the capacity of community based  
 16 services available to victims of shaken baby syndrome.

17 (2) Work with:

18 (A) other state and local governmental agencies;

19 (B) community and business leaders;

20 (C) community organizations;

21 (D) health care and human service providers; and

22 (E) national organizations;

23 to coordinate efforts and maximize state and private  
 24 resources in the areas of prevention of and education about  
 25 shaken baby syndrome.

26 (3) Identify and, when appropriate, replicate or use successful  
 27 shaken baby syndrome programs and procure related  
 28 materials and services from organizations with appropriate  
 29 experience and knowledge of shaken baby syndrome.

30 **Sec. 7.** (a) The shaken baby syndrome education and prevention  
 31 account is established within the state general fund to carry out  
 32 this chapter. The account shall be administered by the state  
 33 department.

34 (b) Expenses of administering the account shall be paid from  
 35 money in the account.

36 (c) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the account  
 37 not currently needed to meet the obligations of the account in the  
 38 same manner as other public money may be invested. Money in the  
 39 account at the end of a fiscal year does not revert to the state  
 40 general fund.

41 (d) The account consists of money accepted by the state  
 42 department from grants and donations from private entities.

Page 2, between lines 18 and 19, begin a new line double block indented and insert:

**"(I) Central nervous system injury as evidenced by central nervous system hemorrhaging.**

**(J) Closed head injury.**

**(K) Rib fracture.**

**(L) Subdural hematoma."**

Page 2, line 19, after "Sec. 3." insert "(a)".

Page 2, between lines 21 and 22, begin a new paragraph and insert:

**"(b) If a program is established under subsection (a), the state department or the division may contract with a statewide nonprofit organization with experience and knowledge in shaken baby syndrome to implement all or part of the program."**

Page 3, line 13, after "state" insert "**and private**".
