SENATE BILL No. 114**

DIGEST OF SB 114 (Updated February 17, 1998 12:06 pm - DI 69)

Citations Affected: IC 16-18; IC 16-41.

Synopsis: Clean indoor air act. Adds dining areas located at state educational institutions, licensed child care centers, licensed child care homes, registered child care ministries, licensed hospitals, and providers' offices as public buildings that are subject to the Clean Indoor Air Act. Provides that a person who smokes in an area designated as a nonsmoking area of a public building, grocery store, drug store, or restaurant commits a Class B infraction. (Current law provides that this violation is a Class C infraction.) Enhances the violation to a Class A infraction if the person has at least three previous unrelated violations within the 12 months immediately preceding the violation.

Effective: July 1, 1998.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 114

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-295, AS AMENDED BY P.L.188-1995,
2 SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 1998]: Sec. 295. (a) "Provider", for purposes of IC 16-25,
4 means a hospice program certified under IC 16-25-1.
5 (b) "Provider", for purposes of IC 16-39 except for IC 16-39-7 and
6 for purposes of IC 16-41-1 through IC 16-41-9 **and IC 16-41-37**,
7 means any of the following:
8 (1) An individual (other than an individual who is an employee or
9 a contractor of a hospital, a facility, or an agency described in
10 subdivision (2) or (3)) who is licensed, registered, or certified as

 16 (5) An employer of a certified emergency medical technician, a
 17 certified advanced emergency medical technician, or a certified
 18 paramedic.
- 19 (c) "Provider", for purposes of IC 16-39-7-1, has the meaning set
 20 forth in IC 16-39-7-1(a).
- 21 SECTION 2. IC 16-41-37-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.110-1997,
 22 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 23 JULY 1, 1998]: Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "public building"
 24 means an enclosed structure or the part of an enclosed structure that is
 25 one (1) of the following:
- 26 (1) Occupied by an agency of state or local government.
 27 (2) Used as a classroom building **or a dining area** at a state
 28 educational institution (as defined in IC 20-12-0.5-1).
 29 (3) Used as a public school (as defined in IC 20-10.1-1-2).
 30 (4) Licensed as a health facility under IC 16-21 or IC 16-28.
 31 (5) Used as a station for paid firefighters.
 32 (6) Used as a station for paid police officers.
 33 **(7) Licensed as a child care center or child care home or**
 34 **registered as a child care ministry under IC 12-17.2.**
 35 **(8) Licensed as a hospital under IC 16-21 or a county hospital**
 36 **subject to IC 16-22.**
 37 **(9) Used as a provider's office.**
- 38 SECTION 3. IC 16-41-37-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.256-1996,
 39 SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 40 JULY 1, 1998]: Sec. 4. A person who smokes:
 41 (1) in a public building, except in an area designated as a smoking
 42 area under section 5 of this chapter;

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1 (2) in the retail area of a grocery store or drug store that is
2 designated as a nonsmoking area by the store's proprietor; or
3 (3) in the dining area of a restaurant that is designated and posted
4 as the restaurant's nonsmoking area by the restaurant's proprietor;
5 commits a Class **B** infraction. **However, the violation is a Class A**
6 **infraction if the person has at least three (3) previous unrelated**
7 **judgments for violating this section that are accrued within the**
8 **twelve (12) months immediately preceding the violation.**
