DIGEST OF HB1193 (Updated January 21, 1998 10:53 am - DI 94)

Citations Affected: IC 8-14-8-3.

Synopsis: Distressed road fund. Allows a county with a population of not more than 50,000 to apply to the distressed road fund for financial assistance to repair roads if the county has met all requirements. (Current law provides that only counties with more narrowly specified population parameters may apply to the distressed road fund.)

Effective: July 1, 1998.

HOUSE BILL No. 1193

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning utilities and transportation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
