
ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1213

DIGEST OF HB 1213 (Updated February 23, 1998 9:17 pm - DI 75)

Citations Affected: IC 4-2.

Synopsis: State elected officials salaries. Increases the salaries of the governor and the lieutenant governor, beginning when the individuals elected in 2000 assume those offices. Increases the salaries of the secretary of state, the auditor of state, the treasurer of state, and the clerk of the supreme court, beginning when the individuals elected in 1998 assume those offices. Increases the salaries of the superintendent of public instruction and the attorney general, effective January 1, 1999. Provides a \$12,000 annual housing maintenance allowance for all state elected officials except the governor effective January 1, 1999. Provides a housing maintenance allowance of \$6,000 for all elected state officials except the governor for the period July 1, 1998 through December 31, 1998.

Effective: January 1, 1998 (retroactive).

HOUSE ENROLLED ACT No. 1213

AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 4-2-1-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1998]: Sec. 1. The salary of the elected officials of the state is as follows:

- (1) For **the governor the following salary:**
 - (A) **Before January 8, 2001**, seventy-seven thousand two hundred dollars (\$77,200) per year.
 - (B) **After January 7, 2001, ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000) per year.**
- (2) For **the lieutenant governor the following salary:**
 - (A) **Before January 8, 2001**, sixty-four thousand dollars (\$64,000) per year.
 - (B) **After January 7, 2001, seventy-six thousand dollars (\$76,000) per year.**

However, the lieutenant governor is not entitled to receive per diem allowance for performance of ~~his~~ duties as president of the senate.

- (3) For **the secretary of state the following salary:**
 - (A) **Before January 1, 1999**, forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) per year.
 - (B) **After December 31, 1998, sixty-six thousand dollars**

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(\$66,000) per year.

(4) For the auditor of state the following salary:

(A) Before December 1, 1998, forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) per year.

(B) After November 30, 1998, sixty-six thousand dollars (\$66,000) per year.

(5) For the treasurer of state the following salary:

(A) Before February 10, 1999, forty-six thousand dollars (\$46,000) per year.

(B) After February 9, 1999, sixty-six thousand dollars (\$66,000) per year.

(6) For the attorney general the following salary:

(A) Before January 1, 1999, fifty-nine thousand two hundred dollars (\$59,200) per year.

(B) After December 31, 1998, seventy-nine thousand four hundred dollars (\$79,400) per year.

(7) For the clerk of the supreme court the following salary:

(A) Before January 1, 1999, thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$38,000) per year.

(B) After December 31, 1998, sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) per year.

(8) For the state superintendent of public instruction the following salary:

(A) Before January 1, 1999, sixty-three thousand one hundred dollars (\$63,100) per year.

(B) After December 31, 1998, seventy-nine thousand four hundred dollars (\$79,400) per year.

SECTION 2. IC 4-2-1-3 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1999]: Sec. 3. (a) This section does not apply to the governor.

(b) Each elected official of the state is entitled to a housing maintenance allowance of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) per year in addition to the salary provided under section 1 of this chapter.

SECTION 3. IC 4-2-1-4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1998]: (a) This section does not apply to the governor.

(b) Each elected official of the state is entitled to a housing maintenance allowance of six thousand dollars (\$6,000) for the period of July 1, 1998 through December 31, 1998.

(c) This section expires December 31, 1998.



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
