

SENATE BILL No. 197

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 31-37-2-5.

Synopsis: Curfew violations. Expands the definition of a delinquent act arising from a curfew violation by specifying that a child who violates a curfew set by a city, town, or county ordinance commits a delinquent act.

Effective: July 1, 1998.

SENATE BILL No. 197

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 31-37-2-5, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-1997, SECTION
2 20, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
3 1998]: Sec. 5. A child commits a delinquent act if, before becoming
4 eighteen (18) years of age, the child ~~commits~~ **violates** a curfew ~~violation~~
5 **imposed** under IC 31-37-3, **including a curfew set by any city, town,**
6 **or county ordinance adopted under IC 31-37-3-4 or IC 31-37-3-5.**
