

# SENATE BILL No. 214

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** None (noncode).

**Synopsis:** Central State advisory committee. Extends the sunset date for the Central State advisory committee by five years. (The current expiration date for the committee is January 1, 1999.)

**Effective:** July 1, 1998.

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January 6, 1998, read first time and referred to Committee on Health and Environmental Affairs.

## SENATE BILL No. 214

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning human services.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. P.L.40-1994, SECTION 87, IS AMENDED TO READ  
2 AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1998]: (a) As used in this  
3 SECTION, "committee" refers to the Central State advisory committee  
4 established by subsection (b).  
5 (b) The Central State advisory committee is established.  
6 (c) The committee consists of the following members:  
7 (1) Four (4) members of the senate appointed by the president pro  
8 tempore of the senate. Not more than two (2) members appointed  
9 under this subdivision may be members of the same political  
10 party. The members under this subdivision must be appointed so  
11 that the following are satisfied:  
12 (A) The senator in whose district Central State Hospital is  
13 located must be a member of the committee.  
14 (B) A senator who serves on the senate committee concerned  
15 with financial matters must be a member of the committee.  
16 (C) A senator who serves on the senate committee concerned  
17 with health matters must be a member of the committee.  
18 (2) Four (4) members of the house of representatives appointed by



1 the speaker of the house of representatives. Not more than two (2)  
2 members appointed under this subdivision may be members of the  
3 same political party. The members under this subdivision must be  
4 appointed so that the following are satisfied:

5 (A) The representative in whose district Central State Hospital  
6 is located must be a member of the committee.

7 (B) A representative who serves on the house committee  
8 concerned with financial matters must be a member of the  
9 committee.

10 (C) A representative who serves on the house committee  
11 concerned with health matters must be a member of the  
12 committee.

13 (d) The president pro tempore of the senate shall appoint the chair  
14 of the committee. After the chair of the committee is appointed, the  
15 speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint the vice chair of  
16 the committee. The chair and the vice chair of the committee may not  
17 be members of the same political party.

18 (e) The committee shall meet at the call of the chair.

19 (f) The affirmative vote of five (5) members of the committee is  
20 necessary for the committee to take any action other than to meet to  
21 take testimony or to adjourn.

22 (g) Each member of the committee is entitled to receive the same  
23 per diem, mileage, and travel allowances paid to individuals serving as  
24 legislative members on interim study committees established by the  
25 legislative council.

26 (h) This subsection does not apply to a transaction or the renewal of  
27 a transaction if the transaction was entered into before January 1, 1994.  
28 Before the state may:

29 (1) sell, lease, or transfer possession of any part of the real  
30 property constituting the grounds of Central State Hospital; or

31 (2) enter into an agreement for any transaction described in  
32 subdivision (1);

33 the governor must submit to the committee a detailed report describing  
34 the proposed transaction and the reasons for the proposed transaction.  
35 Upon receiving a report under this subsection, the chair of the  
36 committee shall call a meeting of the committee to act upon the report.  
37 The committee shall act upon the report within sixty (60) days of  
38 submission by the governor. The state may not proceed with the  
39 transaction until the governor responds to the committee's  
40 recommendation.

41 (i) The committee shall operate under policies and procedures  
42 established by the legislative council.



1 (j) This SECTION expires ~~January 1, 1999~~. **January 1, 2004.**
