

HOUSE BILL No. 1109

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-12-14.6.

Synopsis: Indiana school of fine arts. Allows Indiana University to establish a laboratory school for fine arts beginning in the 1998-1999 school year.

Effective: July 1, 1998.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 20-12-14.6 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 1998]:
4 **Chapter 14.6. Indiana School of Fine Arts**
5 **Sec. 1. Beginning in the 1998-1999 school year, Indiana**
6 **University may establish the Indiana school of fine arts under**
7 **IC 20-12-14.**
8 **Sec. 2. The school shall operate:**
9 (1) a public, residential school for high school students in
10 Indiana; and
11 (2) a program for public school educators.
12 **Sec. 3. (a) A student who applies for admission to the school**
13 **must:**
14 (1) be eligible to attend a public school in Indiana;
15 (2) demonstrate exceptional intellectual ability;
16 (3) demonstrate a commitment to scholarship; and
17 (4) demonstrate a commitment to fine arts.



1 **(b) A student shall be admitted without regard to sex, race,**
2 **religion, creed, national origin, or household income.**

3 **Sec. 4. The school shall:**

4 **(1) establish an advisory committee that represents the**
5 **education and fine arts communities in Indiana;**

6 **(2) determine the standards for admissions and the curricula**
7 **and courses of study to be offered;**

8 **(3) develop curriculum material for distribution and use**
9 **throughout the public school system;**

10 **(4) develop programs to encourage interaction with public**
11 **school educators;**

12 **(5) make curriculum material available to students in public**
13 **schools throughout Indiana by the use of telecommunications**
14 **technology; and**

15 **(6) establish cooperative arrangements with private and**
16 **public entities in order to effectively operate the school.**
