

**CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORT
DIGEST FOR SB 103**

Citations Affected: IC 35-44-2-2.

Synopsis: False informing. Makes the offense of false informing a Class A misdemeanor if a person gives a false report of a commission of a crime or gives false information in the official investigation of the commission of a crime, knowing the report to be false. (Under current law, the offense is a Class B misdemeanor under these circumstances.)

Effective: July 1, 1998.
