HOUSE BILL No. 1053**

DIGEST OF HB1053 (Updated March 24, 1999 2:44 pm - DI 100)

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3.

Synopsis: Alcoholic beverage permits for corporations. Changes the stockholders' residency requirement for a corporation to obtain an alcoholic beverage wholesaler's, retailer's, or dealer's permit of any type. Provides that the alcoholic beverage commission may not issue a small winery permit to a person who has not been a continuous and bona fide resident of Indiana for at least one year.

Effective: Upon passage.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1053

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcoholic beverages.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

Mr. Speaker: Your Committee on Public Policy, Ethics and Veterans Affairs, to which was referred House Bill 1053, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-12-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 3. ~~Small Winery Permit~~. The commission may issue a small winery permit to a person who is the proprietor of a small winery and who desires to commercially manufacture wine. A small winery permit shall be valid from July 1 of the then current year to June 30 of the following year. **IC 7.1-3-21-5 does not apply to a small winery permit issued under this chapter. The commission may not issue a small winery permit to a person who has not been a continuous and bona fide resident of Indiana for at least one (1) year preceding the date of the application for a small winery permit.**"

Page 1, after line 15, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 3. **An emergency is declared for this act.**"

Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
