DIGEST OF HB1184 (Updated March 10, 1999 3:31 pm - DI 97)

Citations Affected: IC 9-18-2-16.

Synopsis: Donations to anatomical gift organizations. Allows a person registering a motor vehicle to make a donation of \$1 or more to organizations that promote the procurement of organs as anatomical gifts. (Under current law, a person registering a motor vehicle may only make a donation of \$0.50.)

Effective: January 1, 2000.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1184

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 9-18-2-16 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2000]: Sec. 16. (a) A person
3 who owns a vehicle must sign an application in ink to register the
4 vehicle.
5 (b) An application to register a vehicle must contain the following:
6 (1) The:
7 (A) name, bona fide residence, and mailing address, including
8 the name of the county, of the person who owns the vehicle; or
9 (B) business address, including the name of the county, of the
10 person that owns the vehicle if the person is a firm, a
11 partnership, an association, a corporation, a limited liability
12 company, or a unit of government.
13 If the vehicle that is being registered has been leased and is
14 subject to the motor vehicle excise tax under IC 6-6-5, the
15 application must contain the address of the person who is leasing
16 the vehicle. If the vehicle that is being registered has been leased

1 and is not subject to the motor vehicle excise tax under IC 6-6-5,
 2 the application must contain the address of the person who owns
 3 the vehicle, the person who is the lessor of the vehicle, or the
 4 person who is the lessee of the vehicle. If a leased vehicle is to be
 5 registered under the International Registration Plan, the
 6 registration procedures are governed by the terms of the plan.

7 (2) A brief description of the vehicle to be registered, including
 8 the following information if available:

9 (A) The name of the manufacturer of the vehicle.

10 (B) The vehicle identification number.

11 (C) The manufacturer's rated capacity if the vehicle is a truck,
 12 tractor, trailer, or semitrailer.

13 (D) The type of body of the vehicle.

14 (E) The model year of the vehicle.

15 (F) Any other information reasonably required by the bureau
 16 to enable the bureau to determine if the vehicle may be
 17 registered. The bureau may request the person applying for
 18 registration to provide the vehicle's odometer reading.

19 (3) A space on the application in which the person registering the
 20 vehicle may indicate the person's desire to donate **fifty cents**
 21 **(~~\$0.50~~) money** to organizations that promote the procurement of
 22 organs for anatomical gifts. **The space on the application must:**

23 **(A) allow the person registering the vehicle to indicate the**
 24 **amount the person desires to donate; and**

25 **(B) provide that the minimum amount a person may**
 26 **donate is one dollar (\$1).**

27 Funds collected under this subdivision shall be distributed by the
 28 bureau as directed by the Indiana department of state health under
 29 IC 16-19-3-26. The bureau may deduct from the funds collected
 30 under this subdivision the costs incurred by the bureau in
 31 implementing and administering this subdivision.

32 (c) The department of state revenue may audit records of persons
 33 who register trucks, trailers, semitrailers, buses, and rental cars under
 34 the International Registration Plan to verify the accuracy of the
 35 application and collect or refund fees due.
