ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1625

DIGEST OF HB 1625 (Updated April 8, 1999 4:10 pm - DI 02)

Citations Affected: IC 14-22.

Synopsis: Wild turkey hunting. Increases the nonresident fee for a license to take a turkey. Allows the department of natural resources to issue a license for a hunter to take an additional turkey if a fall wild turkey season is established. (Current law allows a hunter to take one turkey annually.) (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the natural resources study committee.)

Effective: July 1, 1999.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1625

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 14-22-12-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 1. The department may
3 issue the following licenses and shall charge the following license fees
4 to hunt, trap, or fish in Indiana:
5 (1) A resident yearly license to fish, eight dollars and seventy-five
6 cents (\$8.75).
7 (2) A resident yearly license to hunt, eight dollars and
8 seventy-five cents (\$8.75).
9 (3) A resident yearly license to hunt and fish, thirteen dollars and
10 seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
11 (4) A resident yearly license to trap, eight dollars and seventy-five
12 cents (\$8.75).
13 (5) A nonresident yearly license to fish, fifteen dollars and
14 seventy-five cents (\$15.75).
15 (6) A nonresident yearly license to hunt, forty dollars and
16 seventy-five cents (\$40.75).
17 (7) A nonresident yearly license to trap, seventy-six dollars and

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- 1 seventy-five cents (\$76.75). However, a license may not be issued
 2 to a resident of another state if that state does not give reciprocity
 3 rights to Indiana residents similar to those nonresident trapping
 4 privileges extended in Indiana.
- 5 (8) A resident or nonresident license to fish, including for trout
 6 and salmon, for one (1) day only, four dollars and seventy-five
 7 cents (\$4.75).
- 8 (9) A nonresident license to fish, excluding for trout and salmon,
 9 as follows:
- 10 (A) For three (3) days only, six dollars and seventy-five cents
 11 (\$6.75).
- 12 (B) For seven (7) days only, eight dollars and seventy-five
 13 cents (\$8.75).
- 14 (10) A nonresident license to hunt for five (5) consecutive days
 15 only, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
- 16 (11) A resident or nonresident yearly stamp to fish for trout and
 17 salmon, six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$6.75).
- 18 (12) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a shotgun,
 19 muzzle loading gun, or handgun, thirteen dollars and seventy-five
 20 cents (\$13.75).
- 21 (13) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a muzzle loading
 22 gun, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
- 23 (14) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a bow and
 24 arrow, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
- 25 (15) A nonresident yearly license to take a deer with a shotgun,
 26 muzzle loading gun, or handgun, seventy-six dollars and
 27 seventy-five cents (\$76.75).
- 28 (16) A nonresident yearly license to take a deer with a muzzle
 29 loading gun, seventy-six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75).
- 30 (17) A nonresident yearly license to take a deer with a bow and
 31 arrow, seventy-six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75).
- 32 (18) A resident license to take an extra deer by a means, in a
 33 location, and under conditions established by rule adopted by the
 34 department **under IC 4-22-2**, thirteen dollars and seventy-five
 35 cents (\$13.75).
- 36 (19) A nonresident license to take an extra deer by a means, in a
 37 location, and under conditions established by rule adopted by the
 38 department **under IC 4-22-2**, seventy-six dollars and seventy-five
 39 cents (\$76.75).
- 40 (20) A resident yearly license to take a turkey, fourteen dollars
 41 and seventy-five cents (\$14.75).
- 42 (21) A nonresident yearly license to take a turkey, **one hundred**

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1 **fourteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$114.75).** However, if
2 the state of residence of the nonresident applicant requires that
3 before a resident of Indiana may take turkey in that state the
4 resident of Indiana must also purchase another license in addition
5 to a nonresident license to take turkey, the applicant must also
6 purchase a nonresident yearly license to hunt under this section.
7 **(22) If a fall wild turkey season is established, a resident**
8 **license to take an extra turkey by a means, in a location, and**
9 **under conditions established by rule adopted by the**
10 **department under IC 4-22-2, fourteen dollars and seventy-five**
11 **cents (\$14.75).**
12 **(23) If a fall wild turkey season is established, a nonresident**
13 **license to take an extra turkey by a means, in a location, and**
14 **under conditions established by rule adopted by the**
15 **department under IC 4-22-2, one hundred fourteen dollars**
16 **and seventy-five cents (\$114.75). However, if the state of**
17 **residence of the nonresident applicant requires that before a**
18 **resident of Indiana may take turkey in that state the resident**
19 **of Indiana must also purchase another license in addition to**
20 **a nonresident license to take turkey, the applicant must also**
21 **purchase a nonresident yearly license to hunt under this**
22 **section.**
23 ~~(22)~~ **(24) A resident youth yearly consolidated license to hunt, six**
24 **dollars (\$6). This license is subject to the following:**
25 (A) An applicant must be less than eighteen (18) years of age.
26 (B) The license is in lieu of the resident yearly license to hunt
27 and all other yearly licenses, stamps, or permits to hunt for a
28 specific species or by a specific means.
