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# ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 2035

DIGEST OF HB 2035 (Updated March 25, 1999 2:36 pm - DI 88)

**Citations Affected:** IC 16-18; IC 16-38; IC 16-39.

**Synopsis:** Health records for scientific projects. Allows the Indiana state department of health to develop an immunization data registry. Allows a provider to provide immunization data with a patient's consent. Provides that registry records are confidential. Allows a health provider to disclose health records to a hospital trade association for use in voluntary scientific, statistical, or educational projects with the state department of health. Provides that the provider may disclose the identity of a patient to the hospital trade association only when the disclosure is essential to the project. Provides that certain information is confidential.

## ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 2035

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-26.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: **Sec. 26.5. "Association", for purposes**  
4 **of IC 16-39-5-3, has the meaning set forth in IC 16-39-5-3(a).**

5 SECTION 2. IC 16-18-2-168 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
6 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 168. (a) "Health  
7 records", for purposes of IC 16-39, means written, **electronic**, or  
8 printed information possessed by a provider concerning any diagnosis,  
9 treatment, or prognosis of the patient.

10 ~~(b)~~ The term includes mental health records and alcohol and drug  
11 abuse records.

12 **(b) For purposes of IC 16-39-5-3(d), the term includes**  
13 **information that describes services provided to a patient and a**  
14 **provider's charges for services provided to a patient.**

15 SECTION 3. IC 16-18-2-295 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
16 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 295. (a) "Provider", for  
17 purposes of IC 16-25, means a hospice program certified under

 27 (3) A health facility licensed under IC 16-28-2.  
 28 (4) A home health agency licensed under IC 16-27-1.  
 29 (5) An employer of a certified emergency medical technician, a  
 30 certified advanced emergency medical technician, or a certified  
 31 paramedic.  
 32 **(6) The state department or a local health department or an**  
 33 **employee, agent, designee, or contractor of the state**  
 34 **department or local health department.**

35 (c) "Provider", for purposes of IC 16-39-7-1, has the meaning set  
 36 forth in IC 16-39-7-1(a).

37 SECTION 4. IC 16-38-5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS  
 38 A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
 39 1, 1999]:

40 **Chapter 5. Immunization Data Registry**

41 **Sec. 1. The state department may develop an immunization data**  
 42 **registry.**



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1           **Sec. 2. A provider may provide immunization data to the**  
 2 **immunization data registry with specific written authorization of**  
 3 **the patient.**

4           **Sec. 3. (a) Records maintained as part of the immunization data**  
 5 **registry are confidential.**

6           **(b) The state department may release confidential information**  
 7 **concerning individual immunization patient records to the**  
 8 **immunization data registry of another state or a provider if the**  
 9 **following conditions are met:**

10           **(1) The other state registry or provider has entered into an**  
 11 **agreement with the state department.**

12           **(2) The agreement provides that information that identifies a**  
 13 **patient will not be released to any other person without the**  
 14 **written consent of the patient.**

15           **SECTION 5. IC 16-39-5-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS**  
 16 **FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 3. (a) As used in this**  
 17 **section, "association" refers to an Indiana hospital trade**  
 18 **association founded in 1921.**

19           **(b) Except as provided in IC 16-39-4-5, the original health record**  
 20 **of the patient is the property of the provider and as such may be used**  
 21 **by the provider without specific written authorization for legitimate**  
 22 **business purposes, including the following:**

23           **(1) Submission of claims for payment from third parties.**

24           **(2) Collection of accounts.**

25           **(3) Litigation defense.**

26           **(4) Quality assurance.**

27           **(5) Peer review.**

28           **(6) Scientific, statistical, and educational purposes.**

29           ~~(b)~~ **(c) In use under subsection (a); (b), the provider shall at all times**  
 30 **protect the confidentiality of the health record and may disclose the**  
 31 **identity of the patient only when disclosure is essential to the provider's**  
 32 **business use or to quality assurance and peer review.**

33           ~~(c)~~ **(d) A provider may disclose a health record to another provider**  
 34 **or to a nonprofit medical research organization to be used in**  
 35 **connection with a joint scientific, statistical, or educational project.**  
 36 **Each party that receives information from a health record in connection**  
 37 **with the joint project shall protect the confidentiality of the health**  
 38 **record and may not disclose the patient's identity except as allowed**  
 39 **under this article.**

40           **(e) A provider may disclose a health record or information**  
 41 **obtained from a health record to the association for use in**  
 42 **connection with a voluntary scientific, statistical, or educational**

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1 project undertaken by the association. However, the provider may  
 2 disclose the identity of a patient to the association only when the  
 3 disclosure is essential to the project. The association may disclose  
 4 the information it receives from a provider under this subsection  
 5 to the state department to be used in connection with a voluntary  
 6 scientific, statistical, or educational project undertaken jointly by  
 7 the association and the state department if the association and the  
 8 state department have agreed to the project's scope, nature, and  
 9 duration. The information disclosed by:

- 10 (1) a provider to the association; or  
 11 (2) the association to the state department;

12 under this subsection is confidential.

13 (f) Information contained in final results obtained by the state  
 14 department for a voluntary scientific, statistical, or educational  
 15 project undertaken jointly by the state department and the  
 16 association that:

- 17 (1) uses information disclosed under subsection (e); and  
 18 (2) identifies or could be used to determine the identity of a  
 19 patient;

20 is confidential. All other information contained in the final results  
 21 is not confidential.

22 (g) Information that is:

- 23 (1) advisory or deliberative material of a speculative nature;  
 24 or  
 25 (2) an expression of opinion;

26 including preliminary reports produced in the course of a  
 27 voluntary scientific, statistical, or educational project undertaken  
 28 jointly by the state department and the association using  
 29 information disclosed under subsection (e), is confidential and may  
 30 only be disclosed by the state department to the association and to  
 31 the provider who disclosed the information to the association.

32 ~~(d)~~ (h) A person who recklessly violates or fails to comply with  
 33 subsection ~~(e)~~ subsections (d) through (g) commits a Class C  
 34 infraction. Each day a violation continues constitutes a separate  
 35 offense.

36 ~~(e)~~ (i) This chapter does not do any of the following:

- 37 (1) Repeal, modify, or amend any statute requiring or authorizing  
 38 the disclosure of information about any person.  
 39 (2) Prevent disclosure or confirmation of information about  
 40 patients involved in incidents that are reported or required to be  
 41 reported to governmental agencies and not required to be kept  
 42 confidential by the governmental agencies.

(1) **identifies; or**

(2) **could be used to determine the identity of;**

**a patient. However, information contained in the final results that identifies or could be used to determine the identity of a patient may, in the state department's discretion, be disclosed to the hospital trade association and to the provider who disclosed the information to the hospital trade association.**

**(f) Information that is:**

(1) **advisory or deliberative material of a speculative nature;**  
or

(2) **an expression of opinion;**

**including preliminary reports produced in the course of a**



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**voluntary scientific, statistical, or educational project undertaken jointly by the state department and the hospital trade association using information disclosed under subsection (d) is confidential and may only be disclosed by the state department to the hospital trade association and to the provider who disclosed the information to the hospital trade association."**

**(6) The state department or a local health department or an employee, agent, designee, or contractor of the state department or local health department.**

(c) "Provider", for purposes of IC 16-39-7-1, has the meaning set

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forth in IC 16-39-7-1(a).

SECTION 3. IC 16-38-5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: **Chapter 5. Immunization Data Registry**

**Sec. 1** The state department may develop an immunization data registry.

**Sec. 2.** A provider may provide immunization data to the immunization data registry without specific written authorization of the patient.

**Sec. 3. (a)** Records maintained as part of the immunization data registry are confidential.

**(b)** The state department may release confidential information concerning individual immunization patient records to the immunization data registry of another state or a provider if the following conditions are met:

- (1)** The other state registry or provider has entered into an agreement with the state department.
- (2)** The agreement provides that information that identifies a patient will not be released to any other person without the written consent of the patient."
