Synopsis: Nonresident hunting and fishing license fees. Increases nonresident hunting, trapping, and fishing license fees.

Effective: July 1, 1999.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 48

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 14-22-12-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 1. The department may

13 (5) A nonresident yearly license to fish, ~~fifteen dollars and~~
14 ~~seventy-five cents (\$15.75):~~ **twenty-four dollars and**
15 **seventy-five cents (\$24.75).**
16 (6) A nonresident yearly license to hunt, ~~forty dollars and~~
17 ~~seventy-five cents (\$40.75):~~ **sixty dollars and seventy-five cents**

 2 (7) A nonresident yearly license to trap, ~~seventy-six dollars and~~
 3 ~~seventy-five cents (\$76.75).~~ **one hundred seventeen dollars and**
 4 **seventy-five cents (\$117.75).** However, a license may not be
 5 issued to a resident of another state if that state does not give
 6 reciprocity rights to Indiana residents similar to those nonresident
 7 trapping privileges extended in Indiana.

 9 and salmon, for one (1) day only, four dollars and seventy-five
 10 cents (\$4.75).
 11 (9) A nonresident license to fish, excluding for trout and salmon,
 12 as follows:

 15 ~~(B)~~ for seven (7) days only, **eight dollars and seventy-five**

 23 muzzle loading gun, or handgun, thirteen dollars and seventy-five
 24 cents (\$13.75).
 25 (13) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a muzzle loading
 26 gun, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
 27 (14) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a bow and
 28 arrow, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
 29 (15) A nonresident yearly license to take a deer with a shotgun,
 30 muzzle loading gun, or handgun, ~~seventy-six dollars and~~
 31 ~~seventy-five cents (\$76.75).~~ **one hundred twenty dollars and**

 33 (16) A nonresident yearly license to take deer with a muzzle

 40 location, and under conditions established by rule adopted by the

 42 (19) A nonresident license to take an extra deer by a means, in a



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1 location, and under conditions established by rule adopted by the
 2 department, ~~seventy-six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75):~~
 3 **one hundred twenty dollars and seventy-five cents (\$120.75).**
 4 (20) A resident yearly license to take a turkey, fourteen dollars
 5 and seventy-five cents (\$14.75).
 6 (21) A nonresident yearly license to take a turkey, ~~seventy-six~~
 7 ~~dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75):~~ **one hundred fourteen**
 8 **dollars and seventy-five cents (\$114.75).** However, if the state
 9 of residence of the nonresident applicant requires that before a
 10 resident of Indiana may take turkey in that state the resident of
 11 Indiana must also purchase another license in addition to a
 12 nonresident license to take turkey, the applicant must also
 13 purchase a nonresident yearly license to hunt under this section.
 14 (22) A resident youth yearly consolidated license to hunt, six
 15 dollars (\$6). This license is subject to the following:
 16 (A) An applicant must be less than eighteen (18) years of age.
 17 (B) The license is in lieu of the resident yearly license to hunt
 18 and all other yearly licenses, stamps, or permits to hunt for a
 19 specific species or by a specific means.
