DIGEST OF SB0407 (Updated March 29, 1999 4:37 pm - DI 2)

Citations Affected: IC 36-2.

Synopsis: County animal disease control coordinator. Requires the county executive of each county to designate a county animal disease control emergency coordinator who is responsible for receiving information as to the policy of the state board of animal health on animal disease control matters. Requires the county animal disease control emergency coordinator to distribute information as directed by the state board of animal health.

Effective: July 1, 1999.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 407

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 36-2-16-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 1999]: **Sec. 10. The county executive of each county shall**
4 **designate a county animal disease control emergency coordinator**
5 **who is responsible for receiving information as to the policy of the**
6 **state board of animal health on animal disease control matters. The**
7 **county animal disease control emergency management coordinator**
8 **shall distribute information as directed by the state board of**
9 **animal health. Not later than seven (7) days after making the**
10 **designation, the county executive shall forward the name of the**
11 **county animal disease control emergency coordinator to the**
12 **Indiana state board of animal health.**

Page 1, delete line 6.

Page 1, line 7, delete "control matters.".
