**Summary of Legislation:** This bill changes the membership requirements of the Jackson County Convention and Visitor Commission created under the uniform county innkeeper's tax law. Provides that Jackson County may use money from the innkeeper's tax for industrial and economic development.

**Explanation of Local Revenues:** Jackson County currently levies the uniform county innkeeper's tax. Under current law, the revenue generated through this tax must be used only to promote conventions and tourism in Jackson County. This bill would allow money in the county's convention, visitor, and tourism promotion fund to also be used for the promotion of industrial and economic development. In FY 1998, total collections for the innkeeper's tax in Jackson County were \$237,082.
