**Summary of Legislation:** This bill specifies that the definition of "crime of violence" for purposes of the law concerning concurrent and consecutive sentencing includes an attempt to commit a crime of violence.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 1999.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** This bill would allow courts to consider longer periods of imprisonment in DOC facilities for persons convicted of attempted crimes of violence. The average expenditure to house an adult offender was \$20,500 in FY 97. Individual facility expenditures range from \$11,000 to \$27,000. (This does not include the cost of new construction.)
