**IMPACT:** State

**Summary of Legislation:** This bill provides that for purposes of the tuition exemption at state educational institutions to which the surviving spouse or children of a public safety officer killed in the line of duty are entitled, the term "other required fees" includes room and board expenses.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 1999.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** Based on a survey of institutions of higher education, it appears that less than 10 students are enrolled on Indiana's campuses who are either children or spouses of public safety officers who were killed in the line of duty. Based on the average room and board fee of \$4,500, the cost of a traditional two occupant dormitory room with 20 to 21 meals per week, the additional cost would be \$45,000 per year.

Room and board fees are paid into an auxiliary account separate from the General Operating Budget. All costs related to residence halls are paid from this account. If free room and board is provided to certain students, the costs will be borne by the other students. The state appropriation for universities' operating budgets is not used to cover the costs of the residence halls.
