Summary of Legislation: This bill requires a solid waste district to distribute money in the district's solid waste management fund at the end of the fiscal year as follows: (1) 12.5% to the county or municipality in which a final disposal facility is located for use on roads, parks, or other infrastructure projects within the township or municipality in which the facility is located and (2) 12.5% to the school corporation in which the facility is located for educational programs that concern the environment.

Effective Date: July 1, 1999.

Explanation of Local Expenditures: (Revised) This bill requires that money in each solid waste management district's (SWMD) solid waste management fund at the end of the fiscal year that is not pledged for debt service is to be distributed as follows: (1) 12.5% to the county or municipality in which a final disposal facility is located for use on roads, parks, or other infrastructure projects within the township or municipality in which the facility is located and (2) 12.5% to the school corporation in which the facility is located for educational programs that concern the environment. Under current statute, districts may only use revenue in that fund for the development and implementation of a district plan and to pay the expenses of administering the fund.

Each district that has a district final disposal fee must establish a solid waste management fund. As of January 1999, 25 SWMDs had a district final disposal fee. The amount of money distributed to counties, municipalities, and school corporations is dependent on the amount of revenue in each district's solid waste management fund.
