**IMPACT:** State

**Summary of Legislation:** This bill removes the authority of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) to require an individual to provide the individual's Social Security number to obtain a vehicle title or to register a vehicle.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 1999.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** Removing the BMV's authority to require an individual to provide the individual's Social Security number to obtain a vehicle title or register a vehicle means other numbers, such as the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) or license plate numbers will now be used for obtaining a title or registering the vehicle. It is unlikely that this proposal will have a measurable fiscal impact since the VIN number and the license plate number already are available. It may add to the time it takes to process the titling or registration of the vehicle. The fund affected is the Motor Vehicle Highway Account which supports the BMV.
