Summary of Legislation: This bill defines certain terms concerning chiropractic techniques for the purpose of the chiropractic licensing statute. A physical therapist is prohibited from performing certain procedures. Teaching, doing research, providing advisory services, conducting seminars on physical therapy, or providing physical therapy for students in a school setting by a physical therapist or a physical therapist's assistant who is working under the direct supervision of a physical therapist who is employed by the school or who has a contract with the school that has been approved by the school superintendent does not require the referral from certain health professionals. A licensed physical therapist is prohibited from evaluating a physical disability or mental disorder outside the scope of physical therapy.
