Summary of Legislation: (Amended) This bill establishes the Indiana Youth Development Charter Committee of the state Human Resources Investment Council to collect data and provide recommendations regarding the availability of youth development services. It requires the Committee to submit interim reports to the governor and Legislative Council before November 1, 1999, and November 1, 2000, and a final report before November 1, 2001.

Effective Date: July 1, 1999.

Explanation of State Expenditures: (Revised) This bill establishes an 19 member Indiana Youth Development Charter Committee of the Human Resources Investment Council. The Secretary of the Family and Social Services Administration and the Commissioner of the Department of Correction are non voting members of the Committee. The bill requires the Governor to appoint the chair of the Committee. The bill provides for per diem and travel reimbursement of Committee members. It is assumed that the Human Resources Investment Council will pay for the per diem and travel reimbursement. The Human Resources Investment Council is required to staff the Committee. The amendment requires the Committee to meet eight times each state fiscal year and requires interim reports to the Human Resources Investment Council, the Governor and the Legislative Council before November 1, 1999 and November 1, 2000, and a final report before November 1, 2001. The bill allows the Committee to accept contributions to help pay for the Committee duties.
