**IMPACT:** State & Local

**Summary of Legislation:** This bill provides that, as a condition of probation or parole, a person who is convicted of a sex offense against a child is prohibited from residing within 2,500 feet of school property.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 1999.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** In 1998, 725 sex offenders were released from prison. No information is currently available on the number of persons on probation for sex offenses. Any revocations of parole for violating the provisions of this bill could result in incarceration, most likely in a county jail (\$35 per day) or DOC private-contract facility (\$45 per day).
