IMPACT: State

Summary of Legislation: This bill eliminates the requirement that at least 2,000 of the Pearl Harbor survivor license plates must be sold or renewed before January 1, 2001, or the organization's special group license plate authorization would be terminated. It requires the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to design and issue license plates for a vehicle that designates the vehicle as being registered to a Pearl Harbor Survivor.

Effective Date: January 1, 2000.

Explanation of State Expenditures: This proposal reduces the minimum issuance number of the Pearl Harbor special group license plate. It allows the continued issuance of this special group license plate that otherwise might be discontinued. The specific impact is indeterminable.

Explanation of State Revenues: There were 136 Pearl Harbor Survivor License Plates sold in 1997. There is administrative fee of \$12 charged for each plate. Revenue from these plates is split evenly between the State License Branch Fund which supports the license branches and the Motor Vehicle Highway Account which supports the BMV.
