Summary of Legislation: (Amended) This bill requests the Legislative Council to consider establishing an 13 member Juvenile and Restorative Justice Study Commission. The bill requires the Commission to study issues concerning juvenile law and the concept of restorative justice. It provides that the Commission operates under the policies and procedures of the Legislative Council.

Effective Date: July 1, 1999.

Explanation of State Expenditures: (Revised) This bill requests that the Legislative Council consider establishing a Juvenile and Restorative Justice Study Commission which would consist of eight legislators and five lay members. The bill allows the members who are state employees to receive per diem and all members to receive travel reimbursement. Current Legislative Council Resolution establishes a budget of \$9,000 for Commissions with less than 16 members. The bill would allow the Commission to operate until December 1, 2000.

The bill requires the Legislative Services Agency to provide staff for the Commission.
