Summary of Legislation: This bill establishes the Lobbying Regulation Study Commission to review laws regulating lobbying and to make any recommendations to the General Assembly for changes in those laws.

Effective Date: Upon passage.

Explanation of State Expenditures: This bill creates the Lobby Regulation Study Commission which consists of eight legislative members and five lay members. Each member is entitled to per diem, mileage, and travel allowance. Legislative Council Resolution 1-98 allows for a budget of \$9,000 for an interim study committee. This bill is effective upon passage. If the newly established commission meets prior to June 30, 1999, there would be expenditures in FY 1999.

The Legislative Services Agency is required to provide staff and administrative services for the Commission.
