HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION Honoring William G. Schneider for his Many Years of Dedicated Service to Marion County and the City of Indianapolis.

Whereas, William G. Schneider was elected to his first term in office in 1968 when he was elected to a 4-year term as Marion County Commissioner;

Whereas, In 1969 the General Assembly passed the Unigov Law and the Commissioner's duties became part of the Mayor's office, County Assessor, Treasurer, and Auditor;

Whereas, A 29-member City-County Council was created, and in 1971 the first election was held and William G. Schneider was elected to the first Indianapolis City-County Council, serving seven 4-year terms;

Whereas, William G. Schneider is known as "Mr. Conservative" on the City-County Council since the merger of the city and county governments nearly three decades ago, following the motto, "that government is best that governs least" ;

Whereas, William G. Schneider is one of four council members who have held their posts since the 1971 merger known as Uni-Gov;

Whereas, William G. Schneider is a 12-year member of the Sheriff's Merit Board;

Whereas, William G. Schneider will be stepping down from his position on the City-County Council, letting new faces have an opportunity at governing a great county and a great city;

Whereas, After leaving the City-County Council Willam G. Schneider will still be involved with politics, from a different perspective, faithfully observing his favorite statement of the late U.S. Senator Barry Goldwater, "Extremism in the defense of liberty is no vice; moderation in the pursuit of justice is no virtue"; and

Whereas, William G. Schneider also plans to enjoy his family and grandchildren and to expand his business interests, rewards he so justly deserves for a lifetime of outstanding community service: Therefore,
