## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

---

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring George Glass for his many years of service to Taylor University and his investment in young people.

WHEREAS, *George Glass is admired by his colleagues, respected by his athletes and loved by his students;*

WHEREAS, *George Glass has been an integral part of Taylor University since receiving his bachelor's degree in 1958 and has served in the areas of athletics, academics and currently as Vice President for Alumni Relations;*

WHEREAS, *During his tenure he was selected as a "Distinguished Professor" at Taylor University;*

WHEREAS, *George was honored at the Homecoming 1998 Festivities as a recipient of the Legion of Honor Award at Taylor University - this Award is presented by the Alumni Association of Taylor University to a select few, (only 11 people previously had received this recognition) to an outstanding alumnus or alumna who has achieved distinction by national or international accomplishment and who has promoted the welfare of Taylor University;*

WHEREAS, *The Taylor University Track and Field complex has been named in his honor;*

WHEREAS, *George, along with his wife Jan, served as the National Co-Chair for the Leadership Gifts of the capital campaign for Taylor University;*

WHEREAS, *During his coaching career Mr. Glass was chosen Coach*

*of the Year by opposing coaches in 32 different seasons in cross-country or track;*

*WHEREAS, George Glass' teams, in one stretch, won 14 straight conference championships in addition to 12 State NAIA titles;*

*WHEREAS, George served for seven years as the State NAIA Chairman for the Indiana Division of NAIA;*

*WHEREAS, In the summer of 1970 George was selected to lead the US Track team in international competition in both Paris and Greece;*

*WHEREAS, George has served as the National President of the NAIA Coaches Association, which serves over 3000 coaches nationwide, for a record two elected terms of service;*

*WHEREAS, George was named to the Taylor University Hall of Fame and the NAIA Hall of Fame; and*

*WHEREAS, In 1984 the US Olympic Committee asked George to serve as one of the judges for the Olympics held in Los Angeles, and served as the Chief Judge in 1996 for the Olympic Games held in Atlanta:*  
Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives  
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,  
the Senate concurring:*

Section 1. The Indiana General Assembly wishes to honor George Glass for his dedication to Taylor University, the educational and spiritual growth of its students, his unmatched service and accomplishments in Track and Field and his loving support for his family and friends.

Section 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit copies of this resolution to George Glass and Taylor University.
