A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Huntington College Professor Jack P. Barlow, Sr., on the occasion of his impending retirement.

Whereas, Jack P. Barlow, Sr., who has been a professor of history and political science at Huntington College for more than three decades, has been an influential and significant teacher of thousands of young people, including future teachers, college professors, lawyers, librarians, ministers, school administrators, judges, and community and political leaders;

Whereas, Jack P. Barlow, Sr., has served Huntington College on numerous committees, has directed the January Term Program, chaired the Department of History, chaired the Division of History, Social Sciences, Business, and Education, chaired the Faculty Concerns Committee, served as Faculty Secretary, directed the Forester Lecture series, was Faculty Athletic Representative, was chosen as Faculty Lecturer, served as the Boares Head Festival Lord of Mysrule, and was recognized by the College at its centennial in 1997 as one of the 100 leading personalities in the history of the college;

Whereas, Jack P. Barlow, Sr., has been professionally active in numerous national learned societies and associations including the Conference on Faith and History, the American Historical Association, the Organization of American Historians, the American Society of Church History, the American Association of University Professors, and the Association for Innovation in Higher Education;



Whereas, Jack P. Barlow, Sr., has served on the national executive committee of the Conference on Faith and History and the Association for Innovation in Higher Education, was a trustee of the Christian Scholar's Review, is a member of the editorial board of Fides et Historia, serves as co-editor of the Conference on Faith and History Newsletter, was secretary of the Mid-Central College Athletic Conference, was a member of the board of the Northeast Indiana Civil Liberties Union, was coordinator for the 4th Congressional District Student Program, and was a member of the Government and Legal Issues Committee of the Council of Christian Colleges and Universities;

Whereas, Jack P. Barlow, Sr., has been a leader in the community of Huntington and has been involved in numerous civic activities, including serving as chair of the Huntington County Bicentennial Committee, member of the board of the Quayle Center and Museum Foundation, member of the City-Township Library Board, member of the Lime City Development Committee, Vice-President of the Lafontaine Arts Council, participant on the Samaritan Center Board, Director and Vice-President of the First Presbyterian Foundation, President of the Cosmopolitan Club, member of the County Parks Commission, member of the Mayor's Advisory Council, and popular master of ceremonies at various civic functions;

Whereas, Jack P. Barlow, Sr., has been an active member, session leader, preacher, and teacher in his church, the First Presbyterian Church of Huntington; and

Whereas, Jack P. Barlow, Sr., has been a loving husband to his wife, Rebecca, a wise father to his children, Jack P. Barlow, Jr., and Kim Wood, and a benevolent grandfather to Ashley Barlow and Joshua Wood: Therefore,
