## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

---

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION memorializing Richard Doyle.

*Whereas, Richard D. Doyle passed away June 29, 1998, at the age of 67;*

*Whereas, Richard Doyle was an attorney, a former state legislator, and an anti-smoking activist;*

*Whereas, Richard Doyle, who was a graduate of DePaul University Law School, had been an attorney for more than 30 years, served on the St. Joseph County Tax Adjustment Board, served on the Indiana Parole Board, and was a deputy prosecuting attorney;*

*Whereas, Richard Doyle was first elected to the Indiana House of Representatives in 1970;*

*Whereas, Richard Doyle ably represented District 8 in St. Joseph County for ten years;*

*Whereas, During his tenure in the Indiana House of Representatives, Mr. Doyle championed ideas dealing with mass transit and property tax reform;*

*Whereas, These ideas were often rejected while he was a member of the General Assembly but were later hailed as advances in mass transportation and fairness in taxation;*

*Whereas, Richard Doyle's 23 year struggle with cancer only served to increase his determination to put an end to*



*teenage smoking, a cause in which he was actively involved until the time of his death; and*

*Whereas, Richard Doyle was a man of many talents whose ideas were often judged to be ahead of their time: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives  
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,  
the Senate concurring:*

1           SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly wishes to express  
2 its heartfelt sympathy to the family of Richard Doyle - his wife Nancy,  
3 his four daughters Margaret, Martha, Esther, and Monica, and his three  
4 sons Joseph, James, and Charles.

5           SECTION 2. That the principal clerk of the House of  
6 Representatives shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the Doyle  
7 family.
