A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION to honor all the Indiana optometrists for donating many hours of their time and service to the citizens of Indiana as part of the American Optometric Association's VISION USA program.

Whereas, the gift of eyesight is recognized as one of the most valuable of the senses; and

Whereas, eye diseases can occur at any age, and many of them do not cause symptoms until the disease has caused damage; and

Whereas, eye injuries, 90% of which are preventable, are a major cause of monocular blindness and visual impairment in the United States; and

Whereas, children need to be examined for farsightedness, nearsightedness, crossed eyes, "lazy eye" and other conditions before they start school; and

Whereas, during the week of March 7-13, 1999, the Indiana Optometric Association, in cooperation with the American Optometric Association's VISION USA program, celebrated National Save Your Vision Week; and

Whereas, VISION USA, an acronym for "Volunteers In Service In Our Nation", is a program wherein volunteer optometrists provide free, basic eye health, vision care services and necessary eyewear for uninsured, low-income workers and their families; and

Whereas, each of the nearly 260 Indiana optometrists participating

in VISION USA in 1999 agreed to provide free eye examinations for up to eight qualified VISION USA patients. These eye care professionals have donated more than 16,500 examinations cumulatively over the eight year life of VISION USA; and

Whereas, great positive impact is being made on our state by those who continually volunteer their time for worthy causes such as annual school vision screenings for children and Save Your Vision Week; now, therefore
