

SENATE BILL No. 308

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3-18-9; IC 7.1-4-1-38.

Synopsis: Alcoholic beverage employee permits for volunteers. Changes from \$20 to \$5 the fee for an alcoholic beverage employee's permit when the permit holder uses the permit only to perform volunteer service that benefits a nonprofit organization. Makes administrative provisions and provides that it is unlawful to use for any other purpose an employee's permit obtained for volunteer use that benefits a nonprofit organization.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 308



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcoholic beverages.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-18-9 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 9. (a) The
3 commission may issue an employee's permit to a person who desires to
4 act as a clerk in a package liquor store or as a bartender, waiter,
5 waitress, or manager in a retail establishment, excepting dining car and
6 boat employees.

7 (b) A permit authorized by this section is conditioned upon the
8 compliance by the holder with reasonable rules relating to the permit
9 which the commission may prescribe from time to time.

10 (c) A permit issued under this section entitles its holder to work for
11 any lawful employer. However, a person may work without an
12 employee's permit for thirty (30) days from the date shown on a receipt
13 for a cashier's check or money order payable to the commission for that
14 person's employee's permit application.

15 (d) A person who, for a package liquor store or retail establishment,
16 is:

17 (1) the sole proprietor;



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- 1 (2) a partner, a general partner, or a limited partner in a
- 2 partnership or limited partnership that owns the business
- 3 establishment;
- 4 (3) a member of a limited liability company that owns the
- 5 business establishment; or
- 6 (4) a stockholder in a corporation that owns the business
- 7 establishment;

8 is not required to obtain an employee's permit in order to perform any
 9 of the acts listed in subsection (a).

10 **(e) An applicant may declare on the application form that the**
 11 **applicant will use the employee's permit only to perform volunteer**
 12 **service that benefits a nonprofit organization. It is unlawful for an**
 13 **applicant who makes a declaration under this subsection to use an**
 14 **employee's permit for any purpose other than to perform volunteer**
 15 **service that benefits a nonprofit organization.**

16 SECTION 2. IC 7.1-4-1-38 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
 17 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 38. (a) The
 18 biennial license fee for an employee's permit is:

- 19 (1) twenty dollars (\$20); or
- 20 (2) five dollars (\$5) if the permit is used only to perform
- 21 volunteer service that benefits a nonprofit organization. and
- 22 (b) The term of the permit is two (2) years.

23 SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.

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
