

SENATE BILL No. 493

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-1-2-3.

Synopsis: Recycling of malt beverage. Allows certain sales of a malt beverage for recycling and not for human consumption when the brewer's designated expiration date marked on a container or bottle has passed. Provides that the use of alcohol, alcoholic beverages, or a preparation containing alcohol for research or testing purposes is not prohibited but is controlled, regulated, and confined to alcoholic beverage permit holders.

Effective: July 1, 1999.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcoholic beverages.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 7.1-1-2-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
- 2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 3. ~~Scope: Exceptions:~~
- 3 (a) The provisions of this title shall not prohibit **the following**:
- 4 (1) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation or use of
- 5 vinegar.
- 6 (2) The sale or transportation of sacramental wine to a minister,
- 7 priest, or rabbi for a religious purpose.
- 8 (3) The manufacture, purchase, possession, transportation or
- 9 distribution of sacramental wine for a religious purpose by a
- 10 minister, priest or rabbi.
- 11 (4) The manufacture of wine or beer for use in one's own
- 12 residence.
- 13 (5) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation, or use of
- 14 industrial alcohol. ~~or~~
- 15 (6) Alcoholic beverages held, served, or consumed on airline
- 16 flights.
- 17 (7) **The sale of a malt beverage by:**



1 (A) a brewer; or
2 (B) a primary source of supply for an out-of-state brewer;
3 when the brewer's expiration date on a container or bottle has
4 passed and the sale is for purposes of recycling and not for
5 human consumption.
6 (b) The purchase, transportation to, and the possession of alcoholic
7 beverages for use only in one's own residence shall not be prohibited
8 but shall be subject to the applicable provisions of this title.
9 (c) The manufacture, sale, possession, transportation or use of
10 alcohol or alcoholic beverages, or a preparation containing alcohol for
11 a medicinal, scientific, **research, testing**, or mechanical purpose, shall
12 not be prohibited but shall be controlled, regulated and confined to
13 permittees as provided in this title.

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
