## HOUSE BILL No. 1213



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-8.1-3-4 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 4. ~~Attendance Officers;~~  
3 ~~Appointment in Completely Reorganized Counties.~~ (a) In a county  
4 which has been completely reorganized into one (1) or more school  
5 corporations under ~~IC 1971~~, IC 20-4-1, the governing body of each  
6 school corporation with fifteen hundred (1,500) or more pupils in  
7 average daily attendance shall appoint an attendance officer. The  
8 governing body of each school corporation which has less than fifteen  
9 hundred (1,500) pupils in average daily attendance may appoint an  
10 attendance officer. If the governing body of a school corporation which  
11 has discretion in whether or not to appoint an attendance officer  
12 declines to make an appointment, the superintendent of the school  
13 corporation shall serve as ex officio attendance officer under section 7  
14 of this chapter.

15 (b) When the governing body of a school corporation makes an  
16 appointment under this section, it shall appoint an individual  
17 nominated by the superintendent. However, the governing body may



1        decline to appoint any nominee and require another nomination. The  
2        salary of each attendance officer appointed under this section shall be  
3        fixed by the governing body. In addition to salary, ~~he~~ **the attendance**  
4        **officer** shall receive reimbursement for actual expenses necessary for  
5        ~~him~~ **the attendance officer** to properly perform his duties. The salary  
6        and expenses of an attendance officer appointed under this section shall  
7        be paid by the treasurer of the school corporation.
