SENATE BILL No. 48

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 14-22-12-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 1. The department may
3 issue the following licenses and shall charge the following license fees
4 to hunt, trap, or fish in Indiana:
5 (1) A resident yearly license to fish, eight dollars and seventy-five
6 cents (\$8.75).
7 (2) A resident yearly license to hunt, eight dollars and
8 seventy-five cents (\$8.75).
9 (3) A resident yearly license to hunt and fish, thirteen dollars and
10 seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
11 (4) A resident yearly license to trap, eight dollars and seventy-five
12 cents (\$8.75).
13 (5) A nonresident yearly license to fish, ~~fifteen dollars and~~
14 ~~seventy-five cents (\$15.75):~~ **twenty-three dollars and**
15 **twenty-five cents (\$23.25).**
16 (6) A nonresident yearly license to hunt, ~~forty dollars and~~

- 1 ~~seventy-five cents (\$40.75):~~ **sixty dollars and seventy-five cents**
 2 **(\$60.75).**
- 3 (7) A nonresident yearly license to trap, ~~seventy-six dollars and~~
 4 ~~seventy-five cents (\$76.75):~~ **one hundred seventeen dollars**
 5 **(\$117).** However, a license may not be issued to a resident of
 6 another state if that state does not give reciprocity rights to
 7 Indiana residents similar to those nonresident trapping privileges
 8 extended in Indiana.
- 9 (8) A resident ~~or nonresident~~ license to fish, including for trout
 10 and salmon, for one (1) day only, four dollars and seventy-five
 11 cents (\$4.75). **A nonresident license to fish, including for trout**
 12 **and salmon, for one (1) day only, six dollars and seventy-five**
 13 **cents (\$6.75).**
- 14 (9) A nonresident license to fish, excluding for trout and salmon,
 15 as follows:
- 16 (A) For three (3) days only, ~~six dollars and seventy-five cents~~
 17 ~~(\$6.75):~~ **nine dollars and seventy-five cents (\$9.75).**
- 18 (B) For seven (7) days only, ~~eight dollars and seventy-five~~
 19 ~~cents (\$8.75):~~ **twelve dollars and seventy-five cents (\$12.75).**
- 20 (10) A nonresident license to hunt for five (5) consecutive days
 21 only, ~~thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75):~~ **twenty**
 22 **dollars and seventy-five cents (\$20.75).**
- 23 (11) A resident or nonresident yearly stamp to fish for trout and
 24 salmon, six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$6.75).
- 25 (12) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a shotgun,
 26 muzzle loading gun, or handgun, thirteen dollars and seventy-five
 27 cents (\$13.75).
- 28 (13) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a muzzle loading
 29 gun, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
- 30 (14) A resident yearly license to take a deer with a bow and
 31 arrow, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
- 32 (15) A nonresident yearly license to take a deer with a shotgun,
 33 muzzle loading gun, or handgun, ~~seventy-six dollars and~~
 34 ~~seventy-five cents (\$76.75):~~ **one hundred fourteen dollars**
 35 **(\$114).**
- 36 (16) A nonresident yearly license to take deer with a muzzle
 37 loading gun, ~~seventy-six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75):~~
 38 **one hundred fourteen dollars (\$114).**
- 39 (17) A nonresident yearly license to take a deer with a bow and
 40 arrow, ~~seventy-six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75):~~ **one**
 41 **hundred fourteen dollars (\$114).**
- 42 (18) A resident license to take an extra deer by a means, in a

1 location, and under conditions established by rule adopted by the
 2 department, thirteen dollars and seventy-five cents (\$13.75).
 3 (19) A nonresident license to take an extra deer by a means, in a
 4 location, and under conditions established by rule adopted by the
 5 department, seventy-six dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75).
 6 (20) A resident yearly license to take a turkey, fourteen dollars
 7 and seventy-five cents (\$14.75).
 8 (21) A nonresident yearly license to take a turkey, ~~seventy-six~~
 9 ~~dollars and seventy-five cents (\$76.75).~~ **one hundred fourteen**
 10 **dollars (\$114).** However, if the state of residence of the
 11 nonresident applicant requires that before a resident of Indiana
 12 may take turkey in that state the resident of Indiana must also
 13 purchase another license in addition to a nonresident license to
 14 take turkey, the applicant must also purchase a nonresident yearly
 15 license to hunt under this section.
 16 (22) A resident youth yearly consolidated license to hunt, six
 17 dollars (\$6). This license is subject to the following:
 18 (A) An applicant must be less than eighteen (18) years of age.
 19 (B) The license is in lieu of the resident yearly license to hunt
 20 and all other yearly licenses, stamps, or permits to hunt for a
 21 specific species or by a specific means.
