DIGEST OF SB 188 (Updated February 17, 1999 9:15 A.M.) - DI grg)

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Speech-language and audiology board. Requires the speech-language and audiology board to make legislative recommendations to the legislative council by December 1, 1999 regarding requirements to award a doctor of audiology degree. Requires board to specify the qualifications, standards, and procedure for awarding the doctorate degree.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 188

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: (a) As used in this
2 section, “board” refers to the speech-language pathology and
3 audiology board established by IC 25-35.6-2-1.

4 (b) Not later than December 1, 1999, the board shall make
5 legislative recommendations to the legislative council regarding
6 requirements to award an individual a doctor of audiology degree.

7 (c) The recommendations required under subsection (b) must
8 include the following:

9 (1) The specific education and experience an individual
10 must possess.

11 (2) The type of examination an individual must pass.

12 (3) Any other standards the board determines the
13 individual must meet.

14 (4) The procedure for awarding an individual a doctor of
15 audiology degree who meets the qualifications established
16 under this subsection.

17 (d) This section expires July 1, 2000.

18 SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
