SENATE BILL No. 210

DIGEST OF SB0210 (Updated February 10, 1999 6:13 pm - DI 76)

Citations Affected: IC 9-13; IC 9-21; IC 33-19.

Synopsis: Merging for road construction zone. Amends definition of "worksite" to include certain lanes of a highway leading up to an area upon which construction or maintenance activity is being performed on the highway. Provides that after being directed by a sign to merge into another lane because of a worksite, a person who drives a vehicle may not pass another vehicle within the posted no passing zone established by the Indiana department of transportation. Provides that a violation is a Class C infraction and may be subject to an additional fee.

Effective: July 1, 1999.

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SENATE BILL No. 210

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-200 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 200. "Worksite" means
3 a location or area upon which:

4 (1) a public purpose construction or maintenance activity; or
5 (2) a private purpose construction or maintenance activity that is
6 authorized by a governmental agency;
7 is being performed on a highway. **The term includes the lanes of a**
8 **highway leading up to the area upon which an activity described in**
9 **subdivision (1) or (2) is being performed, beginning at the point**
10 **where appropriate signs directing vehicles to merge from one (1)**
11 **lane into another lane are posted.**

12 SECTION 2. IC 9-21-8-7.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
13 AS A **NEW SECTION** TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
14 1, 1999]: Sec. 7.5. (a) **This section applies to a worksite:**

15 (1) **upon a highway divided into two (2) or more marked lanes**
16 **for traffic moving in the same direction; and**
17 (2) **for which vehicles are instructed to merge from one (1)**

6 SECTION 3. IC 33-19-6-14 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
7 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999]: Sec. 14. (a) This section
8 applies to criminal, infraction, and ordinance violation actions that are
9 traffic offenses (as defined in IC 9-30-3-5).
10 (b) The clerk shall collect a highway work zone fee of fifty cents
11 (\$0.50). However, if the criminal action or infraction is exceeding a
12 worksite speed limit (as provided in IC 9-21-5-11) **or failure to merge**
13 **(as provided in IC 9-21-8-7.5)** and the judge orders the clerk to collect
14 the fee for exceeding a worksite speed limit **or failure to merge**, the
15 clerk shall collect a highway work zone fee of twenty-five dollars and
16 fifty cents (\$25.50).
