SENATE BILL No. 280

DIGEST OF SB 280 (Updated February 1, 1999 2:30 pm - DI 87)

Citations Affected: IC 23-14.

Synopsis: Protecting old cemeteries from desecration. Requires that the person effecting disinterment, removal, and reinterment of a grave give 60 days written notice to the decedent's next of kin and publish the notice in a newspaper of general circulation. Requires the person effecting the removal of graves to file a certificate of removal facts with the county recorder in the county from which the graves were removed and the county in which reinterment is made. Requires that the certificate of removal facts list information contained on the gravestone or other markers, such as the birth date, death date, and family name. Requires that all expenses associated with the disinterment, removal, acquisition of the new burial site, and reinterment be paid by the person

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effecting the disinterment, removal, acquisition, and reinterment. Requires the person effecting the disinterment, removal, and reinterment to ensure that the site for reinterment is suitable and reasonably accessible to relatives of the decedent. Requires that disinterment, removal, and reinterment be performed under the supervision and direction of the county executive or the county executive's designee. Requires that due care be taken to furnish suitable coffins or boxes for reintering human remains and to remove, protect, and replace all gravestones or other markers. Exempts a church, a religious institution, or a religious society from the act.

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SENATE BILL No. 280

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning business and other associations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 23-14-57.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 1999] :

4 **Chapter 57.5. Removal of Graves**

5 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "person" has the meaning set**
6 **forth in IC 23-1-20-18. The term does not include a church, a**
7 **religious institution, or a religious society.**

8 **Sec. 2. A person must satisfy IC 23-14-57-1, IC 23-14-57-2, and**
9 **IC 23-14-57-5 before the removal of a grave in order to comply**
10 **with this chapter.**

11 **Sec. 3. Disinterment, removal, and reinterment of human**
12 **remains may be effected by any of the following persons:**

13 **(1) By:**

14 **(A) the state or its agencies;**

15 **(B) a political subdivision of the state; or**

1 (C) the United States government or its agencies;
 2 when the governmental entity listed in this subdivision
 3 determines that removal is reasonably necessary to perform
 4 the functions and duties delegated to it by law and certifies to
 5 the county executive of the county that contains the human
 6 remains that the removal is reasonably necessary.

7 (2) By a utility when it owns land that is to be used as a
 8 reservoir on which graves are located.

9 (3) By any individual, firm, corporation, sole proprietorship,
 10 partnership, association, limited liability company, fiduciary,
 11 or other legal entity that owns land on which abandoned
 12 cemeteries or burial grounds are located after first securing
 13 the consent of the legislative body (as defined in IC 36-1-2-9)
 14 of the town, city, or county in which abandoned cemeteries or
 15 burial grounds are situated.

16 Sec. 4. (a) The person effecting disinterment, removal, and
 17 reinterment of a grave containing a decedent's remains under this
 18 chapter shall before disinterment:

19 (1) give sixty (60) days written notice of that intention to the
 20 next of kin of the decedent, if known or subject to being
 21 ascertained by reasonable search and inquiry; and

22 (2) cause notice of the disinterment, removal, and reinterment
 23 to be published:

24 (A) at least once per week for four (4) successive weeks in
 25 a newspaper of general circulation if there is only one (1)
 26 such newspaper; or

27 (B) at least once per week for four (4) successive weeks in
 28 two (2) newspapers of general circulation if there is more
 29 than one (1) such newspaper;

30 in the county where the grave is situated. The first publication
 31 may not be less than sixty (60) days before disinterment.

32 (b) Any remains disinterred and removed under this chapter
 33 must be reinterred in a suitable cemetery or burial ground.

34 Sec. 5. (a) The person removing or causing the removal of one
 35 (1) or more graves shall, within thirty (30) days after completion
 36 of the removal and reinterment, file with the county recorder of the
 37 county:

38 (1) from which the graves were removed; and

39 (2) in which reinterment is made;

40 a written certificate of removal facts in the form and manner
 41 required by the county recorder.

42 (b) The certificate of removal facts must contain:



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- 1 (1) an alphabetical listing of the full name, if known or
 2 reasonably ascertainable, of each decedent whose grave is
 3 moved;
 4 (2) a precise description of all information carved on the
 5 gravestone or other marker, including:
 6 (A) dates;
 7 (B) references to family members; and
 8 (C) mementos;
 9 (3) a precise description of the site from which each grave was
 10 removed;
 11 (4) a precise description of the site and specific location where
 12 the decedent's remains have been reinterred;
 13 (5) the full and correct name of the party effecting the
 14 removal; and
 15 (6) a brief description of the statutory basis upon which the
 16 removal or reinterment was effected.
 17 (c) If the full name of a decedent cannot be reasonably
 18 ascertained, the removing party shall set forth all additional
 19 reasonably ascertainable facts about the decedent, including:
 20 (1) birth date;
 21 (2) death date; and
 22 (3) family name.
 23 (d) The county recorder may collect a filing fee under
 24 IC 36-2-7-10.
 25 **Sec. 6.** All expenses of disinterment, removal, acquisition of the
 26 new burial site, and reinterment shall be paid by the person
 27 effecting the disinterment, removal, acquisition, and reinterment,
 28 including the actual reasonable expense of one (1) of the next of kin
 29 incurred in attending the disinterment, removal, acquisition, and
 30 reinterment, not to exceed the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200).
 31 **Sec. 7.** The state department of health shall adopt rules under
 32 IC 4-22-2 governing the registration and indexing of the written
 33 certificate of removal facts, including the form of that certificate.
 34 **Sec. 8.** (a) The person effecting the disinterment, removal, and
 35 reinterment of a decedent's remains under this chapter shall
 36 ensure that the reinterment site is:
 37 (1) of suitable dimensions to accommodate the remains of that
 38 decedent only; and
 39 (2) reasonably accessible to all relatives of that decedent.
 40 (b) The remains may be reinterred in a common grave if:
 41 (1) written consent is obtained from the next of kin; or
 42 (2) the remains came from a common grave and next of kin



1 cannot be identified.

2 (c) If disinterment, removal, and reinterment is effected under
3 this chapter by the state or its agencies or political subdivisions, the
4 United States government or its agencies, or any utility, the
5 disinterment, removal, and reinterment shall be performed by a
6 licensed funeral director (as defined in IC 25-15-2-12).

7 Sec. 9. (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), all
8 disinterment, removal, and reinterment under this chapter shall be
9 performed under the supervision and direction of the county
10 executive or the county executive's designee for the county where
11 disinterment, removal, and reinterment take place.

12 (b) If reinterment is effected in a county different from the
13 county of disinterment with the consent of the next of kin of the
14 decedent whose remains are disinterred:

15 (1) disinterment and removal shall be performed under the
16 supervision and direction of the county executive or the
17 county executive's designee for the county of the disinterment;
18 and

19 (2) reinterment shall be made under the supervision and
20 direction of the county executive or the county executive's
21 designee for the county of reinterment.

22 (c) Due care shall be taken to:

23 (1) do the work in a proper and decent manner;

24 (2) furnish suitable coffins or boxes for reintering the human
25 remains; and

26 (3) remove, protect, and replace all gravestones or other
27 markers so as to leave the gravestones or other markers in as
28 good a condition as that before disinterment or provide a
29 suitable replacement marker.

30 (d) Whenever the remains are to be moved to a perpetual care
31 cemetery or other cemetery where upright gravestones are not
32 permitted, a suitable replacement marker must be provided.

33 Sec. 10. This chapter may not be construed to grant or confer
34 the power or authority of eminent domain or to impair the right of
35 the next of kin of a decedent to remove or cause the removal, at the
36 next of kin's expense, of the remains or grave of the decedent.

37 Sec. 11. A person who knowingly violates this chapter commits
38 a Class B misdemeanor.
