A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION congratulating Ashley Kamuf, of Dale, Indiana, on her outstanding success in archery capturing two world titles in 1998 and the 1999 women's world indoor archery championship.

Whereas, Ashley Kamuf acquired an early interest in archery from her father at the age of eight years old and began learning and developing her skill to the level of an international competitor in just eight short years;

Whereas, Miss Kamuf captured her first 1st place title in 1994 at the Central United States 3-D Bowmaster Shoot, and has persistently won local, state, and national titles ever since;

Whereas, in 1998, Ashley enjoyed an amazing year in competition winning 1st place the Archery Spots Pro-Am in the Women's Class, 1st place at the Michigan Roads Pro-Am, Pro-Class, and 1st place Big'ns Money Shoot, Pro-Class;

Whereas, Ashley Kamuf won state, regional, and national championships in 1998 including 1st place at the Indiana State JOAD shoot, 1st place at the NFAA Sectionals, 1st

place at the NFAA Indiana State Shoot, 1st place at the NAA Regional Tournament, 1st place at the NAA JOAD Nationals, 1st place at the NAA National Tournament, 1st place at the NFAA National Tournament, and 1st place at the NAA Outdoor Nationals;

Whereas, Miss Kamuf captured 1st places in the 1998 NFAA World Shoot and in the Junior 1998 World competition in Sweden;

Whereas, Ashley Kamuf set several state, national and world records in competition during the 1998 season, including a new state record in the NFAA Indiana State Shoot, two national and one world record at the NAA National Tournament, four national records at the NAA Outdoor Nationals, one world record at the 1998 US Open, and a new world record of 600 with 107 X's at the NFAA World Shoot;

Whereas, Ashley recently competed in the women's world indoor championship competition in Havana, Cuba, defeating experienced archers from forty-two countries to win the gold medal and again claim the title as world champion; and

Whereas, it is fitting that special recognition be given to this fine athlete for her hard work and determination in establishing a successful career in archery.

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

- 2 Ashley Kamuf on her successful career in archery and for capturing
