SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION to honor Dr. Max E. Helman for being named president of the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians.

Whereas, Dr. Max Helman of Granger has been named president of the 18,000 member American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians (ACOFP);

Whereas, Dr. Helman has been a doctor of osteopathic medicine since 1967 and views his own patients as part of an extended family; and

Whereas, He is the first doctor from Indiana to receive this honor and is recognized by his fellow physicians and by community leaders as a person who truly cares about both the profession and about people; therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:
