HOUSE BILL No. 1075**

DIGEST OF HB 1075 (Updated February 14, 2000 12:09 PM - DI 77)

**Citations Affected:** IC 14-8; IC 14-15.

**Synopsis:** Boating regulation. Requires boats to be equipped and operated with specific types of personal flotation devices. Reduces, from ten miles per hour to idle speed, the speed at which a motorboat may operate within a specified distance of the shoreline of a lake or channel of a lake. Provides that the department of natural resources (DNR) may adopt rules concerning the establishment of zones where the use of watercraft may be limited or prohibited and the regulation of watercraft engaged in organized activities or tournaments.

# ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1075



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 14-8-2-129 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 129. "Idle speed", **for**  
3 **purposes of IC 14-15-3-17**, means the slowest possible speed, not  
4 exceeding five (5) miles per hour, that maintains steerage so that the  
5 wake or wash created by the watercraft is minimal.

6 SECTION 2. IC 14-15-2-6 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
7 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 6. (a) This section does  
8 not apply to the following:

- 9 (1) A sailboard or windsurfing board.
- 10 (2) A manually propelled boat, such as a racing shell, rowing
- 11 scull, or racing kayak:
  - 12 (A) that is recognized by national or international racing
  - 13 associations for use in competitive racing;
  - 14 (B) in which all occupants row, scull, or paddle, with the
  - 15 exception of a coxswain if a coxswain is provided; and
  - 16 (C) that is designed to carry and carries equipment only for
  - 17 competitive racing.

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1 (b) All boats must be equipped with ~~at least one (1) life preserver,~~  
 2 ~~ring buoy, life jacket, buoyant vest, or buoyant cushion, of a make or~~  
 3 ~~type approved by the United States Coast Guard, for each individual on~~  
 4 ~~board: the number and type of personal flotation devices listed in~~  
 5 ~~this subsection. A person may not operate a boat unless the boat~~  
 6 ~~contains:~~

7 (1) for each person on board, one (1) personal flotation device  
 8 that meets the requirements for designation by the United  
 9 States Coast Guard as a Type I, Type II, or Type III personal  
 10 flotation device; and

11 (2) for a boat at least sixteen (16) feet in length and in addition  
 12 to the requirements of subdivision (1), one (1) personal  
 13 flotation device that meets the requirements for designation  
 14 by the United States Coast Guard as a Type IV personal  
 15 flotation device.

16 (c) The director may waive the requirements of this section for a  
 17 boat during competition in a boat race for which a permit has been  
 18 issued by the department if the following conditions are met:

19 (1) The sponsor of the boat race has informed the director of the  
 20 precautions the sponsor will take to minimize the safety hazards  
 21 that exist due to noncompliance with the requirements of this  
 22 section.

23 (2) The sponsor files with the director a document under which  
 24 the sponsor assumes all liability that may result from the use of a  
 25 boat under the waiver.

26 SECTION 3. IC 14-15-3-17 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
 27 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 17. (a) A person  
 28 operating a motorboat may not approach or pass within two hundred  
 29 (200) feet of the shore line of a lake or channel of the lake at a place or  
 30 point where the lake or channel is at least five hundred (500) feet in  
 31 width, except for the purpose of trolling or for the purpose of  
 32 approaching or leaving a dock, pier, or wharf or the shore of the lake  
 33 or channel.

34 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a person operating a  
 35 motorboat may not approach or pass within two hundred (200) feet of  
 36 the shore line of a lake or channel of the lake at a speed greater than ~~ten~~  
 37 ~~(10) miles per hour: idle speed.~~

38 (c) This subsection applies to lakes formed by hydroelectric dams  
 39 in a county having a population of:

40 (1) more than twenty-three thousand (23,000) but less than  
 41 twenty-three thousand five hundred (23,500); or

42 (2) more than eighteen thousand five hundred (18,500) but less

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1 than eighteen thousand eight hundred twenty (18,820).

2 A person operating a motorboat may not approach or pass within fifty  
3 (50) feet of the shore line at a speed greater than ~~ten (10) miles per~~  
4 ~~hour: idle speed.~~ However, on tributaries of lakes described in this  
5 subsection that are formed by hydroelectric dams, a person operating  
6 a motor boat may not approach or pass within two hundred (200) feet  
7 of the shore line of the tributary at a speed greater than ~~ten (10) miles~~  
8 ~~per hour: idle speed.~~ For the purposes of this chapter, tributaries on  
9 lakes formed by hydroelectric dams do not include the principal body  
10 of water flowing into the lakes.

11 SECTION 4. IC 14-15-7-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
12 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 3. (a) The department  
13 may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement this article concerning  
14 the following:

15 (1) Applications for and the issuance of permits and certificates  
16 required by this article.

17 (2) The conduct of watercraft races.

18 (3) Standards of safety for boats used to carry passengers for hire,  
19 the determination of the maximum weight that may safely be  
20 carried on boats, and the inspection of boats.

21 (4) The safe operation of watercraft upon public water where  
22 unusual conditions or hazards exist, such as any of the following:

23 (A) An obstruction in or along public water.

24 (B) Watercraft traffic congestion.

25 (C) A beach, boat launch, marina, dam, spillway, or other  
26 recreational facility on or adjacent to public water.

27 (5) The placement, location, and maintenance of the following  
28 structures upon public water:

29 (A) Buoys.

30 (B) Markers.

31 (C) Flags.

32 (D) Devices that are used for the purposes of swimming or  
33 extending the use of water skis, water sleds, or aquaplanes.

34 **(6) The establishment of zones where the use of watercraft**  
35 **may be limited or prohibited for the following purposes:**

36 **(A) Fish, wildlife, or botanical resource management.**

37 **(B) The protection of users.**

38 **(7) The regulation of watercraft engaged in group or**  
39 **organized activities or tournaments.**

40 (b) In a rule adopted under subsection (a)(4) or **(a)(6)**, the  
41 department may establish a zone where:

42 (1) the operation of all or some types of watercraft is prohibited;

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- 1 (2) particular activities are restricted or prohibited; or
- 2 (3) a limitation is placed on the speed at which a watercraft may
- 3 be operated.

4 SECTION 5. IC 14-15-12-8 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
5 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 8. A person shall not  
6 operate a personal watercraft on public waters unless every individual:

- 7 (1) operating;
  - 8 (2) riding on; or
  - 9 (3) being towed by;
- 10 the personal watercraft is wearing a personal flotation device that is  
11 approved by the United States Coast Guard under 46 CFR 160 and that  
12 meets the requirements of 310 IAC 2.1, **meets the requirements for**  
13 **designation by the United States Coast Guard as a Type I or Type**  
14 **II personal flotation device**, if applicable.
