DIGEST OF SB 40 (Updated February 15, 2000 4:33 PM - DI 87)

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-5.

Synopsis: Minors at recreational facilities. Allows minors to be present in indoor golf facilities and recreational facilities such as a golf courses, bowling centers or similar facilities where alcoholic beverages are sold.

Effective: July 1, 2000.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 40

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcoholic beverages.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 7.1-5-7-11 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 11. (a) The provisions
3 of sections 9 and 10 of this chapter shall not apply if the public place

6 (2) Convention center.
7 (3) Sports arena.
8 (4) Bowling center.
9 (5) Bona fide club.
10 (6) Drug store.
11 (7) Grocery store.
12 (8) Boat.
13 (9) Dining car.
14 (10) Pullman car.
15 (11) Club car.
16 (12) Passenger airplane.
17 (13) Horse racetrack facility holding a recognized meeting permit

- 21 consumption of food and not the consumption of alcoholic
- 22 beverages.
