Summary of Legislation: This bill establishes a commission consisting of various state house officeholders and agencies to oversee certain aspects of the management of the state house.

Effective Date: July 1, 2000.

Explanation of State Expenditures: This bill establishes a 12-member State House Preservation Commission. The Commission consists of the following members: the Governor, the Chief Justice of the Indiana Supreme Court, the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Auditor of State, the Clerk of the Supreme Court, the Treasurer of State, the Budget Director, a member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, a member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Executive Director of the Legislative Services Agency.

The Commission's duties include review and approval of guidelines governing the temporary placement of exhibits in the public areas of the State House, the landscaping of the exterior grounds of the State House. The Commission will also review and approve the addition, placement and removal of all permanent exhibits in the public areas of the State House, the addition, placement and removal of any statuary or other works of art on permanent display in the public areas and on the exterior grounds of the State House.

The two Commission members who are members of the General Assembly are entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage and travel allowances paid to legislators who serve as members of interim study committees established by the Legislative Council. The current legislative per diem is \$107.
