HOUSE MOTION _____

MR. SPEAKER:

I move that House Bill 1051 be amended to read as follows:

- 1 Page 4, between lines 38 and 39, begin a new paragraph and
- 2 insert:
- 3 “SECTION 5. IC 9-24-11-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.225-1999,
- 4 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
- 5 JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 3. (a) A license issued to an individual less than
- 6 eighteen (18) years of age is a probationary license.
- 7 (b) An individual holds a probationary license subject to the
- 8 following conditions:
- 9 (1) Except as provided in IC 31-37-3-1, the individual may not
- 10 operate a motor vehicle during the curfew hours specified in
- 11 IC 31-37-3-2.
- 12 (2) During the ninety (90) days following the issuance of the
- 13 probationary license, the individual may not operate a motor
- 14 vehicle in which there are passengers unless another individual
- 15 who:
- 16 (A) is at least ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **eighteen (18)** years of age;
- 17 and
- 18 (B) holds a valid operator's license issued under this article;
- 19 is present in the front seat of the motor vehicle.
- 20 (3) The individual may operate a motor vehicle only if the
- 21 individual and each occupant of the motor vehicle has a safety
- 22 belt properly fastened about the occupant's body at all times
- 23 when the motor vehicle is in motion.
- 24 (c) An individual who holds a probationary license issued under
- 25 this section may receive an operator's license, a chauffeur's license, a
- 26 public passenger chauffeur's license, or a commercial driver's license
- 27 when the individual is at least eighteen (18) years of age.

1 (d) A probationary license issued under this section:
2 (1) is valid for not more than four (4) years from the date the
3 license is issued; and
4 (2) may not be renewed.”
5 Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
